

Pupil Premium reporting to Parents

Pupil Premium grant allocation 2014/2015 was £40,300.

The pupil premium grant was allocated as follows

- Purchasing language and literacy resources and training to support the acceleration of progress in writing across key stage 2.
- Sustain the 'listening ear' counselling programme.
- Additional Teaching and Learning hours in the foundation stage, supporting the delivery of the 'Every Child a Talker' programme.
- Additional resources to supplement the delivery of Read write inc phonics.
- Teaching and Learning Assistant hours in all classes to support the delivery of Literacy and Numeracy targeted intervention and support.

Impact of Pupil Premium grant 2014-15

- The school has 100 children on roll.
- The school received funds for 31 children.
- Overall, children from Y1 to Y5 made at least good progress in writing.
- Pupil premium children from Y1 to Y5 made at least good progress in writing.
- The school sustained 1 'listening ear counsellor', the counsellor worked for one afternoon per week. 6 children accessed the counselling service.
- The 'Every Child a Talker' programme was delivered in the Foundation stage, the children who accessed the programme made accelerated progress in the early learning goals of speaking, listening and attention and understanding.
- 71% of children achieved the early learning goals in 2015, this is an increase in 2014 and the school continues to be above other schools nationally.
- 78% of children achieved the expected level in the Y1 phonics screening test. The delivery of Read Write Inc in reception continues to have a positive impact on the progress of children in reading, writing and phonics.
- Overall, children from Y1 to Y5 made at least good progress in maths and reading.
- Pupil premium children from Y1 to Y5 made at least good progress in maths and reading.
