This half term our topic is 'What is our school building made from?'

As part of the topic we will be learning all about:

- The materials that were used to build our school and why they were chosen.
- The properties of different materials.
- Which materials are suitable for which part of our building.
- The changing shape of materials squishing, bending, twisting and stretching.
- The design of buildings and how we can make a model of one using chosen materials.

To make our topic a success I'm calling on all dads and granddads (or mums and grandmas!) to donate small items of building materials. This is so that children can experience first-hand what these materials feel like and how they could be used. I would welcome donations of bricks (only a few!), plastic and metal piping, a roof tile, cement or other joining materials safe to touch, tiles, wood and any other small items of building material you can think of!

### Maths

Maths will see us working on the skills we already know to make sure we are secure. This will include fractions, shape and space and geometry.
