



Impact of Sports Premium Funding - 2014/2015

In 2014/2015, the school was allocated £8600 sports premium funding. The funding has impacted on the schools provision in the ways listed below:

- All children in reception and nursery receive at least 60 minutes of PE teaching per week.
- All children in Year 1 through to Year 6 receive at least 120 minutes of PE teaching per week.
- The PE teaching delivered is consistently good.
- Staff have received training in dance, gymnastics and orienteering.
- The school successfully ran 2 subsidised sports clubs during the school holidays. These were attended by 32 children per day. The children were from across the key stages.
- The school offers a minimum of 1 sport based after school club per term, throughout the year. The club is ran by a qualified coach. Each club is attended by a minimum of 10 children.
- Children have participated in a range of festivals and competitions organised by the 'Bolsover District School Sports Association.
- Key stage 2 children received 6 hours cricket coaching as part of the 'Chance to Shine' cricket programme.

- Key stage 2 children received specialist coaching in orienteering, cricket and athletics for 2 terms. The children participated in an orienteering festival, a cricket tournament and an athletics tournament.
- Reception staff have received balance ability training. As a result all reception children have lessons on balance bikes during their time in reception class. The school purchased 8 bikes to sustain this programme.
- Children in year 5 and 6 have participated in the bikeability programme. 10 children last year received their cycling proficiency award as a result of the programme.
- All midday meal supervisors received play training. As a result the school has a structured programme of activities that all children are able to engage in during lunchtime.
- 13 children have participated in the 'I can do it' project. The project runs at Pleasley Vale outward bounds centre.
- The school has a member of staff responsible for leading sport and PE development in the school.
- The school has been awarded the bronze level award by Sainsbury's School games.
